Thomas Boffin (1831 – 1888?)

For a long time, I've had a marriage for Thomas Boffin, baptised 29 March 1831 at Bicester, Oxfordshire, to Charlotte Howes on 28<sup>th</sup> March 1852 at Oxford, Oxfordshire. I could find nothing to do with either after this date. Note that this Thomas Boffin is not the Thomas Boffin born 6<sup>th</sup> August 1831 in Oxford (he married Elizabeth Taylor in 1855 and they stayed in Oxford).

Last weekend Fold3.com (who specialise in Military records) had free access to their website and I took advantage of it. I did a search on 'Boffin' and came across about half a dozen entries, mainly for Thomas Boffin. Looking at the images, which were about soldiers in the US Civil War, it identified he (and they were all to do with the same person) came from Oxford. The main problem was that the age given was about 5 years out. I thought it was worth further investigation and started searching Ancestry, FindmyPast and FamilySearch. A family tree on Ancestry gave me some clues of sources to look at. But the direction was pointed to Charlotte Boffin. Some States had census in between the 10 year Federal census. In that respect, I was fortunate that there was an 1855 census for New York. It showed Charlotte Boffin with a son, Jacob James Boffin, and her brother James Hows. [Howse seems to be the spelling of the name nowadays]. Jacob James was shown as 4 years old, which would be out of line with other information e.g. he was born in Massachusetts. Jacob was the name of her father and James was the name of Thomas's father. And there was no sign of Thomas Boffin.

The 1860 census for New York shows Charlotte had remarried Oliver Hilton. Further research showed this happened on 29th July 1857 in Brooklyn, New York. She is shown at the marriage as 'Mrs Boffin' but there is no indication as to the status of the previous marriage. Oliver was killed in the Civil War on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1862 in Washington DC. As a result, a claim was put in for a pension and the various documents show the situation with children. It states Jacob James is the wife's son by a previous marriage. In the 1860 New York census Jacob James is shown as aged 6 and his mother aged 28years.

By the 1875 New York census Charlotte had remarried again and this time to Robert Milnes (date currently unknown). Jacob James, aged 21, is still living with his mother. He had taken on his previous step-father's occupation of Tinsmith. Charlotte is shown as aged 43. Unfortunately, Robert passed away 4th February 1877.

Charlotte passed away 21st October 1892 in Brooklyn. All of her husbands were born in England.

Jacob James Boffin married Catherine Lydecker (date currently unknown) They had 3 children:

Lottie Boffin born 7 October New York died Jun 1968

Jacob James Boffin born 30 Jan 1888 New York died 2 April 1918

Edward Boffin born 23 March 1889 New York died October 1971

Catherine (or Kath) died aged 29 (therefore born about 1862) 22<sup>nd</sup> April 1891 at Kings, New York.

Jacob James Boffin (Senior) died 20 July 1901 at Queens, New York; it records the death as drowning and exhaustion. He was buried at Cypress Hills Cemetery. His occupation was given as metal worker.

Lottie Boffin married Albert Scull Prior on 11<sup>th</sup> May 1922 at Dauphin, Pennsylvania. She died June 1968. Her death was registered in Connecticut but her last residence was St Petersburg, Florida.

Jacob James Boffin (Junior) married Edna L Farmer (date currently unknown). Edward does appear in the WW1 Draft Registration in 1917. Unfortunately, he died 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1918 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Edna was the witness on the death register. She does appear in the 1920 census for Jersey City living with her father. It appears that there were no children produced. Edna remarries Louis B Wickes in Manhattan, New York (license dated 21 Jun 1926).

Edward Boffin married Minerva Rauth or Rantz on 4<sup>th</sup> October 1927 in Brooklyn, New York. They had one daughter (that I'm aware of) called Minerva Noel Boffin who was born 27 December 1928 at New Haven, Connecticut. The daughter married David Lockhart Toombs on 25<sup>th</sup> August 1951 at New Haven, Connecticut. They had 1 daughter and 1 son. When the couple were divorced they went to live with her. Apart from the fact that she died 13<sup>th</sup> July 2007 I have no further information. Minerva Noel Boffin is the only person that I have found photographs of (in School Yearbooks). Edward Boffin died October 1971 and his wife 8<sup>th</sup> December 1950 at New Haven, Connecticut.

This ends this Boffin line as I do not know of any other Boffin children.

So what about the Thomas Boffin from Bicester? There are very few hits in searches in the USA. The following are possible hits:

A 'T Boffin' appears in the 1860 census for Kansas. He was aged 28 years (matches), was a miner (no known career) and it says he was born in Canada.

Thomas Boffin signed up for the Union Army on 17<sup>th</sup> August 1861 at Fort Union, New Mexico but the age is given as 25 years. He resigns on 16<sup>th</sup> February 1864 at Huntsville, Alabama but aged 27 years. He then deserts on 30<sup>th</sup> March 1864.

The only other reference I can find is for the death o Thomas Boffin in Chouteau County, Montana. He died  $22^{nd}$  Jan 1888 and was buried in Upper Highwood Cemetery. Findagrave.com has photos of gravestones but none attributed to Thomas. The newspaper 'The River Press' reported 'Mr Boffin was a highly respected citizen of upper Highwood and we believe he owns a farm there. He has no family.'. I have a copy of a document giving a certificate for the property. There are various newspaper articles from 'The River Press' after his death to do with selling the property but I have not accessed these (on subscription site of Newspapers.com). I would think that as probably no one came forward within a period of time to claim the property that it was sold. You didn't have companies specialising in 'heir hunters' as you do today.

I could find few documents for this area during this period as administrations were just be established. If he was 'highly respected' why are so few records? Why did Thomas 'disappear' from the records for about 25 years? Was the army desertion a major factor to stay elusive? And why did he separate from his family early on after reaching the USA?
